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Professions

Early Childhood Educator (ECE)

- **Training:** Typically a diploma or bachelor’s degree in early childhood education, child development, or a related field; often includes supervised practicum and certification/licensing.
- **Job description:** Plans and delivers educational and care activities for young children (usually ages 0–6), supporting cognitive, social, emotional, and physical development in settings such as preschools and childcare centers.

Social Pedagogue

- **Training:** Typically a bachelor’s or master’s degree in social pedagogy, combining education, social work, and psychology; includes extensive practical training.
- **Job description:** Works holistically with children, youth, or adults to promote social integration and personal development, often in residential care, schools, or community services, integrating education, care, and social support.

Youth Worker

- **Training:** Usually a diploma or degree in youth work, social work, community development, or a related discipline; practical placements are common.
- **Job description:** Supports adolescents and young adults through mentoring, programs, and advocacy, focusing on personal development, wellbeing, social inclusion, and risk prevention in community or institutional settings.

Teacher’s Aide (Teaching Assistant)

- **Training:** Typically a certificate or diploma in education support or childcare; requirements vary by setting and may include on-the-job training.
- **Job description:** Assists teachers in classrooms by supporting students’ learning and behavior, preparing materials, supervising activities, and providing additional help to individual or small groups of students.

Nursery Nurse

- **Training:** Usually a vocational qualification or diploma in childcare, early years education, or nursery nursing; may require registration depending on the country.

- **Job description:** Cares for and supports young children (typically from birth to age 5) in nurseries or early years settings, focusing on daily care, health, safety, and early development through play-based activities.

Notes:

- Registration with regulatory bodies and background checks (DBS) are required for working with children.
 - Social work or licensed teaching roles usually require **additional degrees** or licensing exams.
 - Private preschools and community programs often accept Erzieher credentials with U.S. equivalency evaluation.
